

NCF 2023, NEP 2020 and Handwriting in Your School

1. What is NCF 2023?

NCF 2023 means National Curriculum Framework 2023. It is a guide from the Government of India on what children should learn, how teaching should happen, and how schools should assess and report progress. It follows the ideas of NEP 2020 (National Education Policy 2020).

2. What is 5+3+3+4?

NCF says that school life from age 3 to 18 has four stages:

These are the same classes we already know, but now grouped in a new way.

3. What does NCF say about writing and handwriting?

NCF 2023 and NEP 2020 say that children must:

- Build strong hand control and fine motor skills in the early years.
- Learn to write letters and numbers clearly in the Foundational Stage.
- Use writing in all subjects, not only in language periods.
- Develop the habit of neat, organised written work in notebooks.
- Show progress through samples of work and portfolios, not only marks.

Writing is seen as part of full learning, not just a small side activity.

4. Why is this important for your school?

When parents, inspectors or management ask questions like:

- "How does your school follow NEP 2020 and NCF 2023?"
- "How do you build handwriting and written presentation?"

You need a clear answer.



Good handwriting and clear written work help your school to:

- Improve exam performance.

5. How Writewiz fits into NCF 2023

5.1 Foundational Stage (Nursery–Class 2)

This matches NCF focus on fine motor skills and early writing.

5.2 Preparatory and Middle (Class 3–8)

- Keep notebooks neat with margins and headings.
- Lay out sums, diagrams and maps clearly.
- Build writing speed and stamina for classwork and tests.

This matches NCF focus on using writing in all subjects and keeping work organised.

5.3 Secondary (Class 9–10)

- Write faster without letting handwriting break down.
- Plan the answer sheet with margins and sections.
- Present theorems, proofs, equations and essays clearly.

This supports NCF and board expectations in high-stakes exams.
